

Directions to Masjid Muhammad

From North/Northeast:

Take I-95 south toward Washington, DC to I-495S. From I-495, take the Baltimore/Washington Parkway exit (22B) and follow it to Route 50-W exit, which is also New York Avenue. Follow New York Ave. West to First Street, NW. Make a right turn onto First St. NW. Go to P Street and turn left. Follow P Street over to 4th Street (Islamic Way), turn right, and come down mid-block. The Masjid is on the right.

From Northwest:

Take I-70 South to I-495 towards Washington, DC. From I-495, take the Baltimore/Washington Parkway exit (22B) and follow it to Route 50-W exit which is also New York Avenue. Follow New York Ave. West to First Street, NW, make a right turn onto First St. NW. Go to P Street and turn left. Follow P Street over to 4th Street (Islamic Way), turn right, and come down mid-block. The Masjid is on the right.

From South:

Take I-95 North to I-395 North. (I-95 will change to I-395). Stay on I-395 all the way; it will take you to a tunnel which will empty onto New York Avenue. Move over to your left lane. Follow New York Avenue * to First Street NW. Make a left turn onto First St. NW, go to P Street and turn left. Follow P Street over to 4th Street (Islamic Way), turn right, and come down mid-block. The Masjid is on the right.

* NOTE: During rush hour (Monday-Friday 3pm-7pm) you cannot turn left from New York Avenue on to First Street, so, when you leave the tunnel and turn onto NY Ave. Stay in the right lane. When you cross New Jersey Ave, turn right onto M Street, NW. Go to the corner, turn left at First St, and proceed on to P Street. Turn left and proceed as stated above.

Welcome to Masjid Muhammad

We are Honored by Your Presence:

To insure that you are well informed about this Masjid, we are providing you with this helpful information to help make your visit more comfortable.

Removing Shoes:

Before entering the Musalla (Prayer Area) you are required to remove your shoes and place them on the shoe racks provided.

Shoes must be worn in other parts of the Masjid, however.

Entering the Masjid:

Men and women enter the Musalla (Prayer Area) through separate entrances and sit in separate areas in the Musalla.

Seating in the Musalla:

Men sit on the carpeted floor in the front part of the Musalla, and women sit on the carpeted floor toward the rear part of the Musalla. This is not to inconvenience our guests. This is our tradition as established by the Universal Prophet and Messenger Muhammad (Upon him be constant Blessings and Peace.)

Note: If anyone has a special need to sit in a chair, one will be provided especially for the infirmed and the elderly. We respectfully request that you do not occupy a chair if not needed for one of the above-mentioned reasons.

What to Wear to the Masjid:

Men must cover at all times. (No bare chests, muscle shirts, shorts or tight fitting or low hanging pants.) In addition to modest dress, women must cover their heads and the upper and lower parts of their bodies. (No short skirts, open blouses or very tight fitting clothes.)

The Type of Speech in the Musalla:

No profanity of derogatory language of any kind shall be used in the Masjid and there should be no unnecessary rising of voices. The purpose of the Masjid is to worship Allah, The Most High; therefore all activities that take place in it are aimed at worship.

A variety of pamphlets and books are available in the bookstore on the lower level of the Masjid; there are complimentary items and items for sale. If you have any questions about Al-Islam or the

Masjid, please do not hesitate to contact us. It has been our pleasure to meet and greet you. We pray that we have been good hosts. We look forward to your next visit.
